2017 AGC Legislative Scorecard Bill Summaries

State Senate

Floor votes

HB 1086. Promotes the completion of environmental impact statements within two years; requires DOE to report biannually on average time of completion. Passed Legislature, signed by Governor. AGC supported.

SB 5212. Would have clarified that building permit applications vest to environmental ordinances in effect at time of application. Passed Senate, died in House. AGC supported.

SB 5239. "Hirst fix." Among other things, would have allowed a local jurisdiction to rely on DOE water resource rules when approving a subdivision, dedication, or short subdivision to determine if there is available potable water. Passed Senate, died in House. AGC supported.

SB 5621. Would have required coordinated review of projects of statewide significance to expedite permit process. Passed Senate, died in House. AGC supported.

SB 5713. Created the skilled worker outreach, recruitment, and career awareness grant program to help increase the state's skilled workforce. Passed Legislature, signed by Governor. AGC supported.

SB 5734. Increased threshold at which public entity may retain 10% of payment in lieu of surety bond from \$35K to \$150K. Passed Legislature, signed by Governor. AGC supported.

SB 5975. Established paid family and medical leave. Bill was a compromise negotiated among business and labor interests and bipartisan group of legislators. Passed Legislature, signed by Governor. AGC supported.

HB 1538. Requires prime contractors to bond the subcontractors' portion of retainage upon request of subcontractor. Passed Legislature, signed by Governor. AGC opposed.

Bonus/Negative points for bill sponsorship or committee votes

SB 5822. Would have reformed workers' comp system through, among other things, clarification of occupational disease claims and lowering of age barriers for structured settlements. AGC supported.

SB 5788. "Mike M. Johnson fix." Would have made unenforceable contract clauses that waive claim rights for failure to submit a claim notice in a particular time frame or form, absent material prejudice. Passed out of Senate Committee on Law and Justice. AGC supported.
